### Highlights

- No confirmed case was reported within the week. Total confirmed cases as at **11<sup>th</sup> October, 2020** remains 248 with 17 deaths. This is because no testing occurred within the week due to Laboratory workers strike
- 147 samples were collected within the week. Total samples pending testing is now 361
- No mortality was reported within the week
- No recoveries were reported within the week

### Epidemiological summary

As at 11th October, 2020, 2,400 suspected cases have been reported, out of which 248 were confirmed positive, 1,791 were found negative, while 361 results remain pending. Majority of confirmed cases were from Yola North. So far, a total of 208 recoveries and seventeen deaths were recorded. Additionally, a total of 1,290 contacts have been registered and 1,249 have exited.

Fig 1. Distribution of cases by LGA

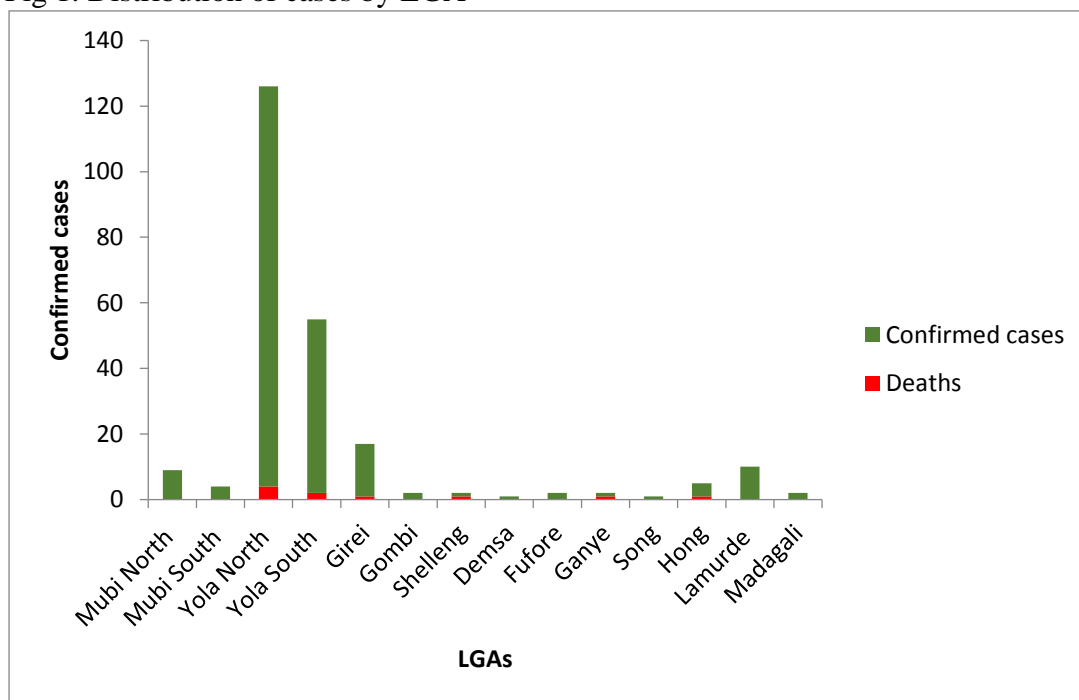

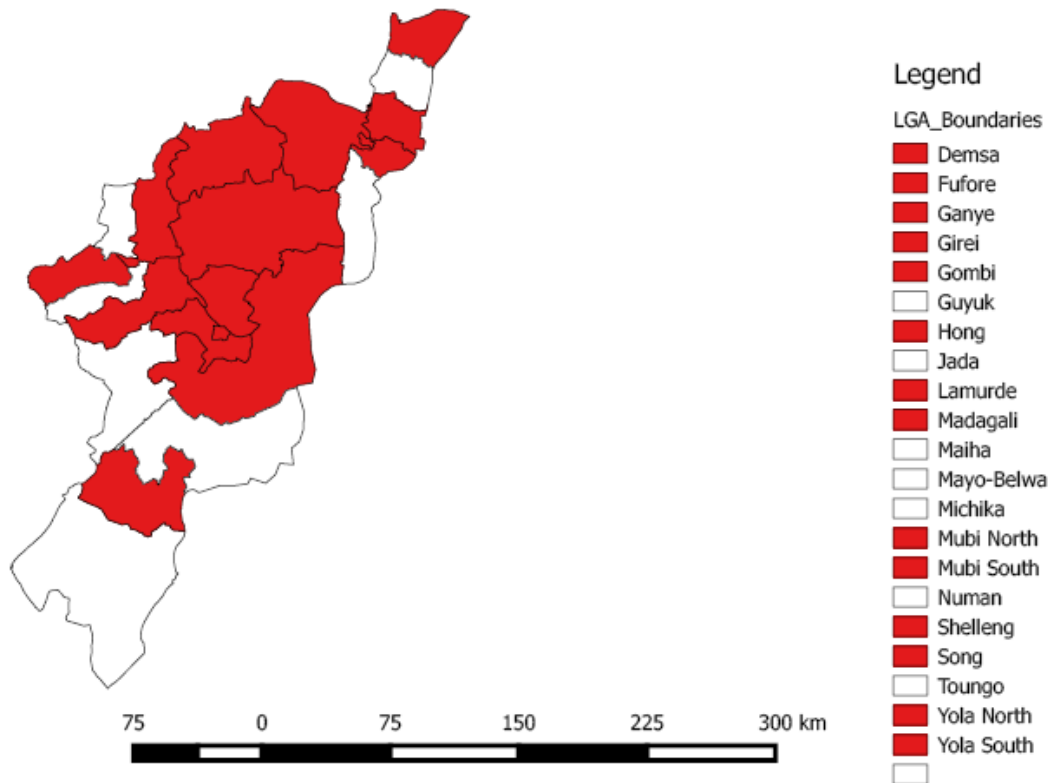


Figure 1. Map of Adamawa State showing LGAs with confirmed COVID-19 cases as at **11<sup>th</sup> September, 2020**

**Coordination:**

- Coordination meetings now holding on Mondays and Thursdays at the State level
- 

**Surveillance:**

- 248 out of **2,039** samples tested are positive. Giving a positivity rate of 12.2%
- 46% of confirmed cases are known contacts of previously confirmed cases
- 13.3% of confirmed cases are health workers
- Contact to case ratio is 5.2
- 14 out of 21 LGAs (67%) have reported at least one confirmed case
- Phase one of the LGA RRT training supported by the World Bank funding has been completed with 7 LGAs and 28 persons trained

### **Case Management**

- A total of 17 fatalities associated with COVID-19 have been reported since outbreak. CFR= 6.9%
- 2/17 (12%) deaths occurred in the community with 1 death of a health worker reported.

### **IPC**

- Routine decontamination of treatment centre ongoing

### **Laboratory**

- 147 samples were collected within the week

### **Risk Communication/Social Mobilization**

- WHO is supporting the documentation of testimonials of survivors of COVID-19 as part of efforts to reduce stigmatization associated with the disease, therefore improving voluntary community testing
- UNICEF supported the sensitization of chairpersons of Ward Development Committees and all Health Educators of the 21 LGAs on how to create community demand for COVID-19 testing
- Ongoing daily broadcast of 25 jingles per day in Radio Nigeria Fombina FM, 30 jingles per day by Gotel Radio; 10 jingles per day by ABC Radio, 5 jingles per day by Pulaako FM and 5 TV jingles per day in Adamawa State Television

### **Challenges**

- Sample testing is stalled due to strike by laboratory workers working in the molecular laboratory.
- Sample collection has been suspended because of the strike of laboratory workers. No sample has been taken in the last 2 days.
- Tracing of contact not possible because of the lack of testing
- 7 LGAs still underperforming in terms of number of suspected cases being reported.

### **Next steps**

- Continue advocacy for the quick resolution of the impasse between the striking workers and Government
- Support training of LGA RRTs in priority LGAs
- Support the re-invigoration of COVID-19 response in 7 underperforming LGAs in terms of detection of suspected cases
