### Highlights

- Nine confirmed cases were reported within the week as against zero case in the preceding week. Total confirmed cases as at **25<sup>th</sup> October 2020** is 257 with 19 deaths.
- No death was reported within the week. CFR to 7.4%
- 76 samples were collected within the week as against 105 samples collected in the preceding week. A decline of 38%.
- Total samples pending testing is now 372
- An additional LGA (Mayo Belwa) reported a confirmed case of COVID-19. Bringing the number of LGAs with at least 1 confirmed case of COVID-19 to 15

### Epidemiological summary

As at 25<sup>th</sup> October 2020, 2,581 suspected cases have been reported, out of which 257 were confirmed positive, 1,952 were found negative, while 372 results remain pending. Majority of confirmed cases were from Yola North. So far, a total of 238 recoveries and nineteen deaths were recorded. Additionally, a total of 1,290 contacts have been registered and 1,290 have exited.

Fig 1. Distribution of cases by LGA

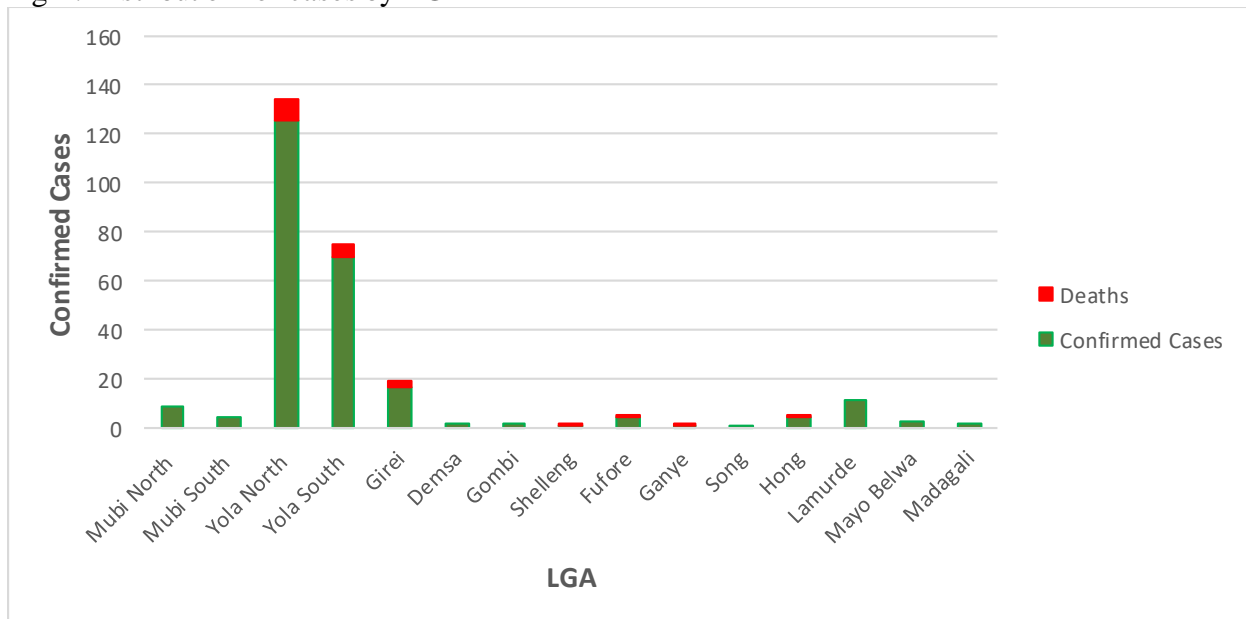

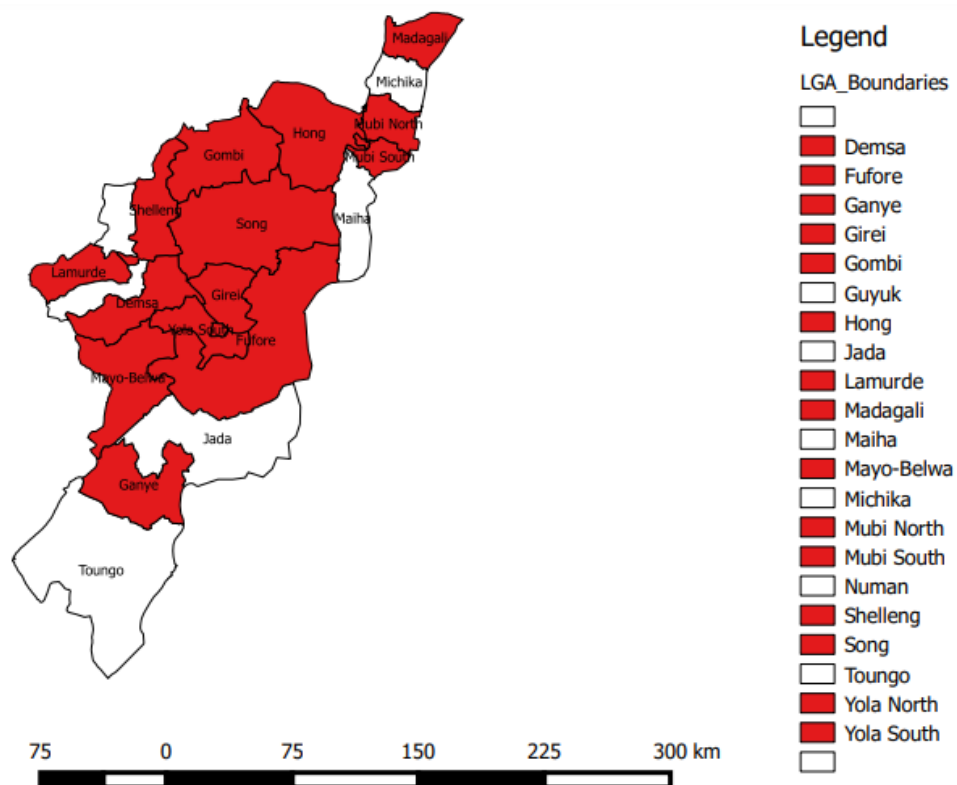


Figure 1. Map of Adamawa State showing LGAs with confirmed COVID-19 cases as at **25<sup>th</sup> October, 2020**

**Coordination:**

- Coordination meetings now holding on Mondays and Thursdays at the State level
- Discussion with the state regarding the PCR lab has still not resolved preventing the resumption of testing in the molecular laboratory

## Surveillance:

- 257 out of 2,209 samples tested are positive. Giving a positivity rate of 11.6%
- 44% of confirmed cases are known contacts of previously confirmed cases
- 12.8% of confirmed cases are health workers
- Contact to case ratio is 5.0
- 15 out of 21 LGAs (71%) have reported at least one confirmed case
- An additional LGA (Mayo Belwa) reported a confirmed case within the week. Bringing number of LGAs with at least 1 confirmed case to 15

## Case Management

- A total of 19 fatalities associated with COVID-19 have been reported since outbreak. CFR= 7.4%
- 2/19 (12%) deaths occurred in the community with 1 death of a health worker reported.

## POE

- A total of 492 passengers were screened at Yola Airport with none detected as a suspected case of COVID-19.

## Laboratory

- 76 samples were collected within the week.
- 372 samples are still pending in the laboratory
- The Laboratory Scientist working in the molecular laboratory are yet to resume testing of samples in Yola

## Risk Communication/Social Mobilization

- The State PHCDA with funding from UNICEF had a meeting with all LGA chairman to discuss how to improve compliance to COVID-19 protocols in their LGA, and improve voluntary community testing
- Ongoing daily broadcast of 25 jingles per day in Radio Nigeria Fombina FM, 30 jingles per day by Gotel Radio; 10 jingles per day by ABC Radio, 5 jingles per day by Pulaako FM and 5 TV jingles per day in Adamawa State Television

## Challenges

- Some samples have been in storage for over 3 weeks without testing.
- Molecular Laboratory in Yola is still not working. Samples are being sent to NRL Gaduwa, Abuja
- Laboratory turn-around time of over 6 days is affecting contact tracing and monitoring
- The confirmed cases to contact declined from 5.2 to 5.0
- ENDSARS protests and the curfews imposed affected the logistics of sample collection and transportation

## Next steps

- Continue to advocate to the State Government to reactivate testing of COVID-19 in the State
- Support trained volunteers to trace contacts of all confirmed cases

- Continue to collect and transport samples to National Reference Laboratory Abuja, pending when sample testing will recommence in the State
